Thank you for your letter to the Honourable Danielle Smith, Premier of Alberta, expressing support for the development of the Maskwa Medical Center (MMC). As Minister of Health, I appreciate the opportunity to respond on behalf of the Government of Alberta, and I apologize for the delay in my reply.

Alberta's government appreciates MMC representatives' significant efforts to deliver a state-of-the-art health facility that will improve accessibility and provide high-quality health care in the region. Rest assured that Alberta Health is working with the MMC on a Clinical Alternative Relationship Plan (ARP) to fund physician services at the facility once it is established. Clinical ARPs provide an alternative compensation model to the traditional fee-for-service model.

Alberta Health is evaluating the MMC's proposal to identify funding opportunities. MMC representatives may also explore funding opportunities with the federal government or through private partnerships.

You may also be interested to know that Alberta Health recently entered into a grant agreement with the Northern Alberta Primary Care Academic Clinic to provide clinical teaching in Grande Prairie. This three-year grant will provide operational support for the clinic, which will train primary care physicians, nurse practitioners, and other allied health professionals. This will enhance primary care services for rural communities.
